

GETTING READY FOR THE BIG DAY

There are those who are convinced that the day of our death is the end of everything.

"When you're dead, you're dead. So get all the gusto you can while you're alive."

There are those who see death as the beginning of Purgatory.

Jesus keeps it simple.

He tells the thief dying beside him,
